2021 saw another outstanding year with our results showing





OXBRIDGE SUCCESS



My second year at Cardiff was during Covid-19 unfortunately, but the school tried to create as many safe, socially distanced events



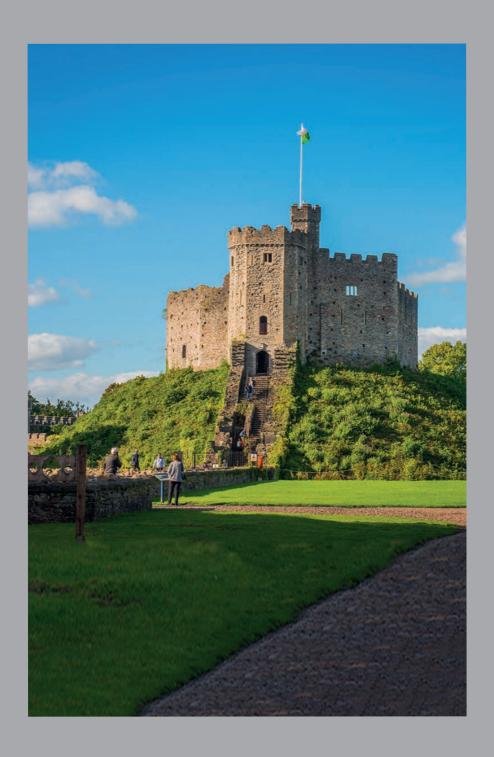
